Academic Updates and Highlights

Humanities Update: This is an exciting week in Upper School Humanities! Mr. Sasser's class will have a special guest helping us begin our study of what is possibly Shakespeare's greatest work, his tragedy *Hamlet.* Miss Prentis's class continues to move along with Erasmus's *Praise of Folly* and *Here I Stand* about the life of Martin Luther.

Table Talk (What to talk about around the dinner table)

Beauty: A Rhetorical Discussion

Last Wednesday, Rhetoric 2 students (all juniors) discussed 3 articles on beauty. Here are their conclusions in summary:

Overall, a creative God, who is himself beautiful, gives inherent beauty to all observers— of both the material and immaterial— to recognize, celebrate, and elevate. While the definition of "beauty" has been hijacked by mass marketing and distorted definitions of physical beauty, true, lasting beauty as created by God exists as an inherent quality, NOT something subjectively defined by each onlooker. Thus, beauty is everywhere; it is a responsibility, privilege even, for a person to recognize it in God's creation. It can be found in the physical traits of an object, virtue of a person, or acts of human beings.

Augustine asked whether things are beautiful because they give delight or whether they give delight because they are beautiful. Augustine concluded that it was the latter. Viewing beauty through a biblical lens provides observers ample opportunity to see beauty. Students noted that beauty could be observed in the following:

- Seeing the Fruits of the Spirit in people
- The complexity of people and their full range of human emotions
- Telling someone about Christ
- Connecting with others
- Self-sacrifice, living in community, building one another up
- Acknowledgement that God created each person and each has a purpose
- The complexity of the systems of the human body; the solar system's order
- God keeping everything in order yet taking an interest in every aspect of peoples' lives

We are thankful for students who think well and process the big questions of this world through the lens of Scripture. Feel free to discuss the idea of beauty with your students (any age), asking them questions that they may see the world in a way that honors our Creator.

Ask: What is the difference between being "pretty" and being "beautiful"? What is the difference between one's outward appearance and one's inward appearance? How can a person work on his or her inward appearance? What are some beautiful acts you have witnessed? How can we find "beauty" in what the rest of the world considers "ugly"?

Dress Down Day Guidelines

Uniforms encourage students to operate as a team and empower them to express themselves in the ways that we train: through their clear thinking and expression of ideas, not just their clothing. Dress down days are privileges, and are not intended to be opportunities to draw attention to oneself in a distracting manner. If a student is unsure about an item of apparel, he or she should bring a substitute item with him/her and immediately check with the US Dean or Headmaster and be prepared to change if it is deemed distracting or usafe. Here are specifics:

- Students should wear pants [no shorts/ yoga/stretch pants or pants with tears].
- Text on shirts/sweatshirts should be appropriate; if text features the name of another school, it should only be one for whom a student participates as an athlete.
- No tight-fitting shirts, tank tops, cut offs, or short shirts.
- Skirts of modest length may be worn by young ladies.
- Footwear should not be high heels, flip flops, or sandals.
- No hats or sunglasses.
- No attire that is deemed by teachers to be distracting.
