When Our Routine Changes

Sometimes children wish for the superpower of being able to tell the future. Adults know that this gift would be difficult to bear when the future held challenges. So, we willingly sit under God's providences and continue to rejoice in all of the ways he is working—both invisibly and visibly.

Here are a few additional tips/revisions for this transfer to remote learning:

- 1. Parents' and teachers' attitudes about this shift will be reflected in how students respond. May we enter this period with humble and thankful hearts. I, for one, will be VERY thankful to see my students' beautiful smiles!
- 2. The REMOTE MASTER SCHEDULE IS REVISED. Please refer to the schedule in this document. Here is how it works: Students will follow their normal schedules by period. So, if a student has Mr. Sasser for Dialectic Humanities first period, he/she will be in LIVE instruction sessions first period on the days listed on the schedule. Questions? Email Mrs. Zuccola.
- 3. Students will access their classes with the meeting codes on their Google Classroom pages.
- 4. Please make sure that your student can log into Google Classroom tonight. Check that he/she is enrolled in all of their classes. If not, there is a plus button in the top right with which he/she can add the class. The codes can be accessed HERE.
- 5. ALL students should be in the WCA Upper School Students classroom in which they will receive announcements, lecture, and chapel. If the entire student body needs to be made aware of anything, teachers will post there.
- 6. Note that the online live instruction ends at 2:00pm; HOWEVER, a teacher may request to meet with a student between 2-3:30 to give extra help or administer a quiz.
- 7. Remind students that attendance is MANDATORY for live classes. Missed classes will result in zeros for work missed during that class.
- 8. All students should log into Classroom each day as assignments may be posted that can be completed without live instruction.
- 9. Pray with and for your students and their teachers! Ask that the Lord would be pleased to accomplish much while we are physically away from the building, that any affected individuals would heal completely, and that we would have hearts all-the-more grateful to be together when we are able to return to live instruction.

Remote Learning Schedule:
