

#### **Humanities Update:**

This week in Humanities your Dialectic students will continue with their study of King Arthur in Mr. Sasser's class. #### Resolutions

New Year's resolutions mean the opportunity to "reset". Common resolutions include eating healthier, budgeting more wisely, losing weight, organizing life better, ultimately living more disciplined lives. So many of the resolutions we make include limiting or decreasing things, especially things of the world. Most resolutions are made for good reasons; however, instead of doing less of something, consider instead doing more— surrendering unto the Lord. Seeking first God's kingdom means that all else will follow. So here is the challenge: Resolve, as a family one way to prioritize abiding in God's Word. Discuss with your children ways that your family can prioritize this and commit to staying in the Word. Here are a few ideas:

- Family devotions in the evenings (before or after dinner, mornings, or before bed)
- Study a book of the Bible together as a family
- Commit a passage of scripture to memory as a family

#### Handbook Highlight

#### **Dress Code Rationale**

The Bible says that "man looks at the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart" (I Samuel 16:7). God knows the spiritual condition of a person's heart, but people initially see only the physical body and how it is attired. Being properly attired is important, must be appropriate for the occasion, can affect behavior and development. Wearing uniforms helps minimize social competition and self-consciousness.

WCA students wear uniforms in an effort to:

- Promote an atmosphere of order and neatness that suggests a readiness for learning,
- Eliminate the temptation for students to discriminate against others who don't dress "a certain way" or buy specific brands.
- To promote a serious academic atmosphere by encouraging the students to think of their attire as an aspect of their work.
- To promote a sense of identity with the school and fellow students and to reinforce the concept that one's identity is based on who God says he/she is and not on what he/she wears.
- To provide financial and social benefits for parents by limiting students' school clothing needs.

Parents' full support of this dress code is imperative. Parents' monitoring of the dress code from home minimizes uniform concerns interrupting instructional time.
